We are now in the age of digital communications and information transfers.

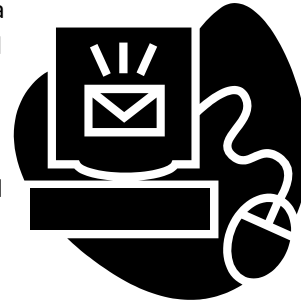
Our club has been on a path embracing new technologies for the betterment of the club over the last few years with the website, email, electronic FOB access to the property, and video monitoring.

One of remaining areas that has not been touched is how we distribute our newsletters. Every time we send out a newsletter to the membership we are spending approximately \$800. If we send out four newsletters a year, it costs the club about \$3200—money that could be better spent on range or hall improvements or other programs.

The Board of Directors has reviewed this and believes that we should take the

next step and start sending emails with a link to the newsletter that will be posted on the club website. For our current membership of about 800, we have email addresses for just over 2/3's of you. By sending out the emails we could save approximately \$550 for each mail-out or \$2200 per year. We recognize that not everyone has a computer and an email account so we will still have to mail out some of the newsletters to keep everyone informed. IDPA — What exactly is IDPA? By Ken Mathiassen & Kim Gilmore, IDPA Co-Chairs

IDPA is an acronym for International Defensive Pistol Association, which is a worldwide competitive shooting organization that uses stock pistols and revolvers. The targets are IDPA standard cardboard that are either in stationary or moving stands at distances of up to 35 yards with an emphasis on using cover or shooting on the move. IDPA uses a variety of props to create different stages or scenarios for a mix of fun and competition.

CFGPA IDPA meets every Wednesday evening from 5:30 pm - 9:00 pm and usually the first Sunday of every month for a full day match. Check the CFGPA calendar for exact dates. If you are interested, feel free to come out and join us, no need to have a handgun for your first time.

As a new club and the only IDPA in the Lower Mainland, our numbers are steadily growing but with that growth the

need for more varied stages and more props also increases. With that in mind we are looking for donations of the 55 gallon plastic or metal barrels, steel for moving target stands, sheeting and 2x2s for walls, as well as lathing for the targets to further challenge our members and allow for more exciting stages. Also, if any of you are steel fabricators and can donate your time and expertise to making some of the moving target stands please contact Ken Mathiassen.

We are currently in the process of building pistol bays as the end of the trap range and need clean fill to build the side berms. If you know of anyone with clean fill they are willing to donate to the club please let us know. If you know of any construction companies that will have dirt available over the next few weeks, again please let Ken Mathiassen know. CFGPA can provide tax receipts for any company willing to donate. The

quicker we get these bays built the sooner the whole club can enjoy the benefits.

Range Signs By Bob Wallbank, Range Chairman

There still seems to be some confusion about what the range flags mean and when it is safe to shoot. In the interest of safety and helping people understand when and where they can shoot we have added some more signage to the range. Some of you may have already seen this signage, but those that haven't, I will explain it here.

The first sign you will see when there is an event or work on the range, is a 2' x 3' yellow sign on the range gate that says "Range Close for _____ Event". When you see this the entire range is closed to all shooters except those participating in the event.

At the range flag pole, there is a new sign that says, "ATTENTION When the Black Powder flag is raised — *all other ranges are CLOSED.*"

This means that when the Black Powder flag is raised, the group is down on the Black Powder Trail or the Hawk & Knife Trail that go *across the back of the other ranges*. Shooting when that flag is raised **could result in the injury or death of someone**. To assist in ensuring this does not happen, we



have also had stop signs made, as pictured here, that are on chain that can be stretched across the entrance to the 25—200 metre Range when events or work is happening down range.

Despite our best efforts to inform people of the range rules/procedures, there have been too many close calls. Let's keep everybody safe by reading and obeying the signs and using our heads. Thank you.

It has been another good year for membership with many returning and new members. We now have approximately 800 members!

I know many people are wondering about the photo ID cards that we were talking about last fall. Unfortunately, the person that was working on this resigned and we have not had anybody with the technical ability and time to take it over. It is something that we are still planning to do and hope to have accomplished by the end of the year.

A note of change to the membership fees—in the past the club has had to remit GST on the membership fees. No one except for the Treasurer and CRA saw this because it was included with the fees, but it amounted to \$4.29 in tax per regular membership. With the new HST coming in (for now), this amount jumps to \$10.80. The club cannot afford to absorb this increase, so the tax is no longer going to be included in the fees, but charged on top of the fees. Sorry, but thank Mr. Campbell.

What has happened to the NFA? By Clive Edwards, Firearms Chair, CFGPA

The NFA recently held an election of officers and directors, the first such election in many years. Dave Tomlinson, one of the founders of the NFA, ran the organization autocratically rather than democratically during his tenure. While this was not according to the by-laws, many if not most members, if they knew or cared about how the organization was run, were more concerned about the effectiveness of the organization. Mr. Tomlinson was not only surprisingly effective at determining the legal weaknesses of the Firearms Act; he supported

many important legal challenges such as that of Bruce Montague.

When Dave died a few years ago Blair Hagen was Vice President Communications and Randy Coombes was Vice President Finance. Randy was effective in growing the membership. Blair was a nice man who was very polite and enjoyed debating the merits and lack of merit in our system of gun control. The executive was down one member with Dave's demise.

The elephant in the room at Dave's

death was Sheldon Clare, president of NFA BC. He convinced Randy and Blair to move Blair to the President's chair and bring Sean Penny into Blair's vacated position as VP Communications. Almost immediately, Sheldon engineered Randy's ouster from the NFA, requiring only the votes of Blair and Sean. If Randy objected, he could bring it up at the next Annual General Meeting, if he still happened to be a member in good standing. Randy tried to renew his membership but his application and payment languished on a bulletin board at

NFA headquarters, as per instructions from Sheldon and Blair. (It has come to light since that other members trying to renew, if they objected to the way Sheldon, Blair and Sean were doing things, had their renewals similarly denied).

Randy Coombes tried to deal with his situation by taking the NFA to court. He won. The judge said that Sean Penny was not a properly constituted member of the executive, not actually being a member of the NFA when he was appointed, and that all decisions made by the executive since Sean's appointment were null and void, including Randy's ouster. The judgment directed the NFA to remedy the situation. This has not been done. The judgment can be read at www.nfatv.com by clicking on the word "DOCUMENTS" on the upper left quadrant of the page.

Sheldon wrote a new Constitution and Bylaws for the NFA and declared them passed by a mail out ballot. Unfortunately, he did so unconstitutionally according to the existing bylaws, which required any changes be presented, discussed and voted on at an Annual General Meeting.

I could not for personal reasons attend the NFA Annual General Meeting in Edmonton on May 15. Below is Sheldon's posting on Gun Nutz (a thread which he started and immediately closed to pre-

vent discussion and/or comment):

NFA Annual General Meeting

The NFA annual general meeting held in Edmonton over the weekend of May 15 has now ended. The membership and directors decided upon increased advocacy, an ambitious marketing program, re-branding, and other changes in support of a new and vigorous Canada's National Firearms Association. There will also be significant resources allocated to growth and improved communications. The membership also accepted a 2009 financial statement and 2010 budget in excess of one million dollars as presented by the treasurer. Many thanks are owed to the office staff for their hard work in setting up the AGM, and also, thanks to those activist members who attended.

We have a fantastic line-up of programs for them:

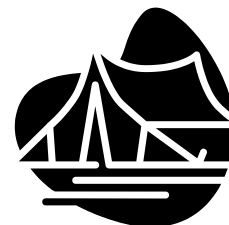
